Bergen Volunteer Medical Initiative (BVMI) Awarded COVID-19 Emergency Grants for Crisis Healthcare and New Telemedicine Program

Funds will help support BVMI's COVID-19 emergency response and recovery to more than 1,500 uninsured patients in Bergen County

(Hackensack, NJ) – Today, the Bergen Volunteer Medical Initiative (BVMI) announced a list organizations, foundations and local corporations that have to date awarded BVMI COVID-19 emergency grants to help fund a new telemedicine initiative and support BVMI's mission to continue to provide free healthcare to uninsured, low-income adults in Bergen County.
